



Agriculture Conservation Plans and Best Management Practices (BMPs)

- **Runoff Problems & Importance**

- The runoff from agricultural properties is a significant contributor to stream and groundwater pollution
- The fertilizers used and proximity of livestock/other animals to streams have a significant impact on water quality
- Implementation of BMPs such as infiltration facilities, rain barrels, swales, stream buffers, etc. can improve water quality
- In Brecknock Township, exemptions from the Stormwater Management Ordinance requirements for new impervious are possible if an Agricultural property has an approved Conservation Plan and/or Nutrient Management Plan
